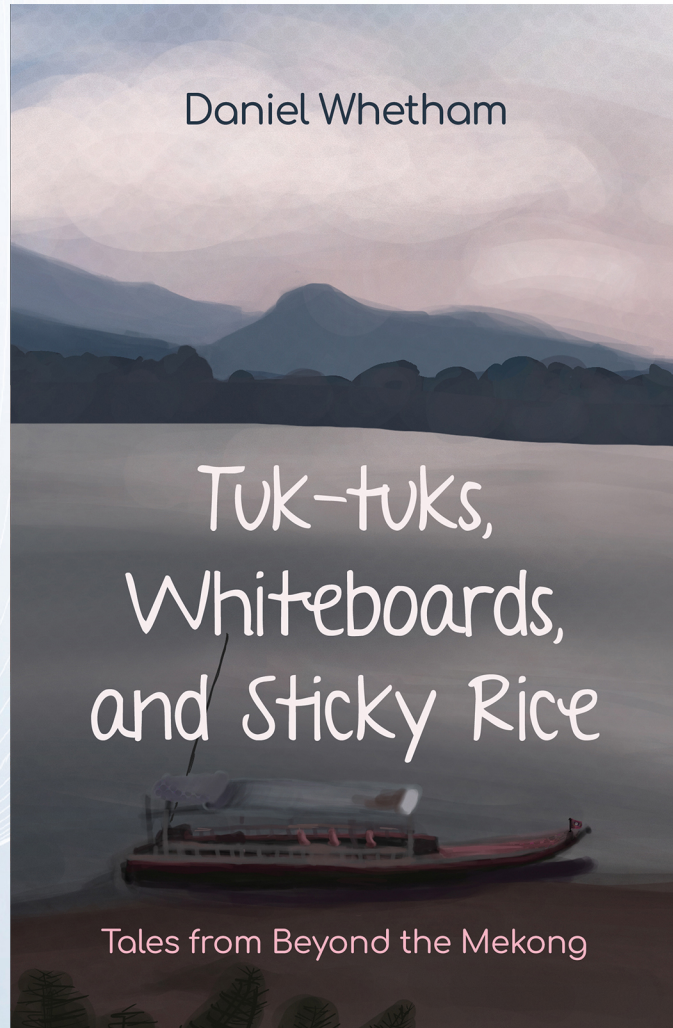


# Tuk-tuks, Whiteboards, and Sticky Rice
